

APRIL 12, 2020 - PALM SUNDAY

SPECIAL HYMNS OF THE DAY:

The consumption of fish is permitted today.

The first hymn chanted at the Small Entrance is the Festal Apolytikion for Lazarus Saturday/Palm Sunday:
Τὴν κοινὴν Ἁνάστασιν πρὸ τοῦ σοῦ Πάθους πιστούμενος, ἐκ νεκρῶν ἤγειρας τὸν Λάζαρον, Χριστὲ ὁ Θεός· ὅθεν καὶ ἡμεῖς ὡς οἱ Παΐδες, τὰ τῆς νίκης σύμβολα φέροντες, σοὶ τῷ Νικητῆ τοῦ θανάτου βοῶμεν· Ὠσαννὰ ἐν τοῖς ὑψίστοις, εὐλογημένος ὁ ἐρχόμενος, ἐν ὀνόματι Κυρίου.

O Christ our God, before Your Passion, You raised Lazarus from the dead to confirm the common Resurrection for all. Therefore, we carry the symbols of victory as did the youths, and we cry out to You, the victor over death, Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

At the procession with the Gospel, the special Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) for Palm Sunday is chanted: Εὐλογημένος ὁ ἐρχόμενος ἐν ὀνόματι Κυρίου· Θεός Κύριος καί ἐπέφανεν ἡμῖν, Σῶσον ἡμᾶς, Υἰέ Θεοῦ, ὁ ἐπί πώλου ὄνου καθεσθείς, ψάλλοντάς σοι, Ἀλληλούϊα.

Blessed in He who comes in the name of the Lord; God is the Lord and has revealed Himself to us. Save us, O Son of God, who sat on the foal of a donkey, we sing to You, Allelua.

Then, we hear the festal hymn once again, followed by a second one, which turns our focus the Resurrection: Συνταφέντες σοι διὰ τοῦ Βαπτίσματος, Χριστὲ ὁ Θεὸς ἡμῶν, τῆς ἀθανάτου ζωῆς ἡξιώθημεν τῆ Ἀναστάσει σου, καὶ ἀνυμνοῦντες κράζομεν· Ὠσαννὰ ἐν τοῖς ὑψίστοις, εὐλογημένος ὁ ἐρχόμενος, ἐν ὀνόματι Κυρίου.

As by baptism we were buried with You, O Christ our God, so by Your Resurrection were we deemed worthy of immortal life; and praising You, we cry: Hosanna in the highest; blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord.

Then, the Festal Kontakion is heard:

Τῷ θρόνῳ ἐν οὐρανῷ, τῷ πώλῳ ἐπὶ τῆς γῆς, ἐποχούμενος Χριστὲ ὁ Θεός, τῶν Ἁγγέλων τὴν αἴνεσιν, καὶ τῶν Παίδων ἀνύμνησιν προσεδέξω βοώντων σοι· Εὐλογημένος εἶ ὁ ἐρχόμενος, τὸν Ἁδὰμ ἀνακαλέσασθαι.

In Heaven, He is seated upon a Throne and on earth He rides upon a foal. O Christ our God, accept the praise of the Angels and the hymn of the Children who cry out to You, "Blessed are You who comes to recall Adam."

Epistle Reading: Philippians 4: 4-9. Brethren, rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let all men know your forbearance. The Lord is at hand. Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, do; and the God of peace will be with you. [RSV]

Gospel: John 12: 1-18. Jn. 12:1-18 Six days before Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. There they made him a supper; Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at table with him. Mary took a pound of costly ointment of pure nard and anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped his feet with her hair; and the house was filled with the fragrance of the ointment. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (he who was to betray him), said, "Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" This he said, not that he cared for the poor but because he was a thief, and as he had the money box he used to take what was put into it. Jesus said, "Let her alone, let her keep it for the day of my burial. The poor you always have with you, but you do not always have me." When the great crowd of the Jews learned that he was there, they came, not only on account of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. So the chief priests planned to put Lazarus also to death, because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus. The next day a great crowd who had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" And Jesus found a young donkey and sat upon it; as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" His disciples did not understand this at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that this had been written of him and had been done to him. The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead bore witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ, on this Palm Sunday 2020, I regret that I must greet you in writing, rather than in person. It is my hope that many of you will be able to follow the service by using the live feed on the Church's website (stnickspgh.org), so you can pray along with Deacon Robert and myself. The same goes for all the usual services of Holy Week (see the calendar on the last page of the bulletin). I look forward to the day when we will once again be together to praise the Lord and give thanks for all our blessings.

During this time when we must live in isolation from one another in order to keep all of us safe, many people have found this a good opportunity to do those things we have always said we wanted to do, but have never had the time for – such as cleaning out the attic or digging a garden. May I also suggest that we use this time to tend to our spiritual life, as well. We can start by setting aside a few minutes in the morning and at night to devote to prayer. We can also pick up our Bibles and really explore their content. After all, what we hear in Church is just a small fraction – the tip of the iceberg – of what is actually contained there. We can also turn to one of the many books about our faith that are available today, or seek out websites on the Internet where we can learn more about the Orthodox faith (such as our Archdiocese's website, goarch.org).

We are grateful to all our parishioners and friends who have sent in pledge payments or other donations recently. They remind us of how important it is for those of us who have not suffered lay-offs or other economic reversals due to the corona virus to remember our Church during this difficult time. As we prepare once again to celebrate Holy Week (even if from a distance), we count on your continued support to help preserve our Church and our community, until we can once again greet one another as one family in Christ.

60 Minutes Highlights Saint Nicholas National Shrine on Western Easter

New York - On Western Easter, Sunday April 12th, the renowned CBS news program, 60 Minutes, will showcase the rebuilding of the Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine at the World Trade Center.

The relationship between the Archdiocese and *60 Minutes* dates back over a decade, when the late Bob Simon did a groundbreaking interview with His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew that aired in December of 2009.


In the press materials released by CBS yesterday, the rebuilding of Saint Nicholas and reopening is referred to as "both a beacon and some kind of miracle." In his introduction to the story, 60 Minutes journalist Scott Pelley said, "For Easter, we visit a fortress against time, where art is created to heal one of America's greatest wounds. It is the story of the resurrection of the only House of Worship destroyed on 9/11."

His Eminence Archbishop Elpidophoros commented on the coming broadcast, "We are very moved that the longest running and most prominent television news program in the United States is highlighting our campaign to rebuild Saint Nicholas during this holiest time of the year. With the Friends of Saint Nicholas, whose generosity and energy have restarted this sacred duty, we look forward, by the grace of God and the prayers of the Saint, to opening the doors of the Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine on September 11, 2021."
