

FATHER'S MESSAGE

December 2020

But when the time had fully come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. (Galatians 4:4-5)

Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Recently, I sent an important message to everyone who is on our parish email list. I will summarize it here, both as a reminder, and also to inform those who did not see the email, or who do not use computers. Because of the recent spike in the number of COVID-19 cases, as well as the increasingly dire predictions of even worse to come in the next few weeks, we have received strong recommendations from both the civil and church authorities to make the following changes, effective immediately:

- 1) in-person gatherings for reasons other than worship will be replaced as much as possible with "virtual" meetings online, using platforms such as Zoom. This includes Church school classes (following the example of the Greek school), Church organization business meetings, GOYA meetings, etc.
- 2) the coffee and fellowship hour after Sunday worship has been suspended until further notice.
 - 3) there will be no basketball or other athletic practice sessions for our youth.
 - 4) no church-sponsored in-person social events for adults or young persons will take place.
- 5) At the same time, existing arrangements for worship remain as is: certain pews are blocked off in such a way as to physically distance every distinct party; everyone must remain masked the whole time; everyone must sign in, so they can be traced and informed in the event that someone tests positive for COVID; and everyone must follow directions entering and exiting the sanctuary and when coming forward for Holy Communion or for antidoron (blessed bread) at the end.

It is most regrettable that we continue to face such a frightening, chaos-producing menace at this most precious time of year, when we are accustomed to gathering with family, friends, loved ones, associates, and fellow church members in order to break bread, celebrate, and prepare to welcome and glorify the newborn Lord. When the outbreak began, we all assumed that it would be over in a few weeks or a couple months at most! I never expected that I would still have to send out messages such as this after such a long time!

There is a verse from the Bible that may offer some comfort to us in times such as this. Matthew 1:23 quotes the prophet Isaiah: "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emmanuel (which means, God with us)", in reference to the miraculous conception and birth of the Savior, who is, indeed, *God with us*! In the manger lay a little baby, small and helpless, who nevertheless was the One through whom all things were created, now come to set things right, and open the way for us into God's Kingdom. He did not arrive with great fanfare, nor was he born in a palace – but rather, in a barn. His first cradle was not made of the finest cedar and lined with satin pillows, but rather, was an animal food trough, filled with straw. From such humble beginnings the Savior began His journey to save the world and, indeed, the whole universe, and transform it into God's Kingdom. During His earthly ministry He healed countless individuals and changed many hearts. But he also was rejected by many others. God is still with us – the Risen Lord – in our midst, walking with us, inspiring some, but being cursed by others.

The world as created has all sorts of life in it – including viruses, which must serve some sort of purpose (only God knows, in this case). God is with us, when human beings cooperate and collaborate to understand the

virus and discover its vulnerabilities; when they then proceed to find ways to counter it with medications; and when they help our bodies' own immune systems fight it off with vaccines. God is with us, when people collaborate across borders and without regard for religion or past history or political persuasion to save lives by sharing technologies and medicines that work. God is with us, when medical science advances, and helps to reduce the threat posed by such pathogens. God is best represented by the remarkable number of nonprofit organizations -- many of which are affiliated in some way or were founded by Christian churches or associations -- who work tirelessly in the field to bring these miracles of medical science to the poorest of the poor in remote and forgotten places or in countries torn apart by civil or religious wars. There *is* reason for hope, you see, after all.

At the same time, though, God is also with us if and when we do get sick from the virus – or any other illness. We do not worship an aloof, abstract deity, cold and indifferent to the suffering of humanity. On the contrary, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who came to comfort the afflicted and who cried at the tomb of His friend Lazarus, is also present with us in our times of trial and anguish. He will see us through to the end – whether that means blessing us with full recovery or welcoming us into His eternal Kingdom when our these our frail, earthly bodies succumb. And, God is with us even when we find ourselves isolated and alone as individuals or couples at home or in a senior residence because, for reasons of health or advanced age, we are at especially grave risk from the virus. We cannot go out, but neither can anyone safely come to see us. We miss our children and our friends. We mourn those who have passed away during this time, whose funerals we were unable to attend. One blessing we have, however, which never would have existed in the past (as long as we have access to a computer that is connected to an online network), is the ability to watch livestream showings of all our worship services from the Cathedral; along with those of most of the other Orthodox churches in our area.

Jesus said, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10). He was referring, presumably, primarily to life in God's eternal Kingdom. However, life in this world is a necessary prelude to life in the world to come. That our world is filled with so much suffering – hunger, disease, war, cruelty etc. – is a result of our collective refusal as the human race of our Lord's offer of abundant life. That is because that life can only come when we give, rather than take, forgive, rather than hold a grudge, when we exchange humility for our pride, when we put other's welfare ahead of our own and love even those who hate us. These are hard things even to think about or understand, I know, because they are all so counter-intuitive. And yet, this is what Jesus taught – and lived. He is our Emmanuel. May His living presence inspire us, as well, to follow His good example during this Nativity season and throughout the year, and that of so many saints before us, who came to know Christ intimately through their lives of dedication, sacrifice, and love for God and neighbor. And may their prayers, together with those of the All-Holy Theotokos and Mother of God and all the saints, bring us peace, good health, and growth towards God during this Nativity season and in the New Year 2021.

Our former spiritual Father and Hierarch Metropolitan Maximos of Pittsburgh fell asleep in the Lord on Monday, November 2, 2020. His funeral took place here at the Cathedral on Saturday, November 7, with His Eminence Archbishop Elpidophoros of America officiating, along with His Eminence Metropolitan Savas of Pittsburgh, a number of other Orthodox bishops representing other jurisdictions from the area, and several clergy from the Metropolis. Many more priests and presvyteres were in the pews, along with family and friends, Archons, and other laypeople. Our deepest condolences to his family, both here and throughout the world, including longtime members of our Cathedral family Jim and Linda Hages and children, who cared for the Metropolitan in his waning years. They worked closely in organizing the funeral with His Eminence Metropolitan Savas and his Chancellor, Fr. George Callos, who guided the rest of us through the many details of what to do when an Orthodox hierarch passes away.

The services were beautiful and inspiring for all who attended. I hope they were, as well, for those who watched from home on the special equipment that was rented just for this occasion (which gives us a taste of what is possible, with our potential new audio-visual system!). Special recognition goes to President Vasili Copetas and numerous others from the Parish Council whose generosity with their time, talents, and patience added up to a thoroughly professional and welcoming setting for all of our guests. They went above and beyond the call of duty in cooperating with Fr. Callos and with His Eminence's family in order to make a traditional Orthodox funeral for a bishop possible in these difficult times. Thank you, my friends and co-workers, for all of your hard work, over many hours, cheerfully given. In line with the proud tradition of service that characterizes this Cathedral, you rose to the occasion and accomplished all that was asked of you. May God grant you many years.

I knew Metropolitan Maximos for many years and loved him dearly. In my experience, he was a loving and generous person, a great scholar, and a great man of God, but he was sometimes misunderstood. I hope to offer more thoughts about this in a future newsletter. May God grant His Eminence eternal rest, and may his memory be eternal.

The Sunday dates are December 6 (St. Nicholas Day), December 13 and December 20, 2020.



GREEK SCHOOL

St. Nicholas Greek School is continuing virtually with the continuance of Covid 19. The new curriculum for most of the school has an e-book feature which allows the teacher access to show and teach the textbook as well as the workbook through zoom. In addition, all teachers also use various games to help teach students vocabulary, and grammar.


The times for each of the students' classes varies with the schedule of the teacher and child. But adult classes, taught virtually by Toula Protopapa, are done virtually with a set time. Classes for Intermediate 1 are on Mondays from 6 pm until 7:30 pm; for Intermediate 2 on Wednesdays from 6:15 pm until 7:45 pm; and Beginners on Thursdays from 6:15 pm until 7:45 pm.

As the Nativity of our Lord approaches and we are unable to enjoy our annual Christmas program and party; we have decided to try a virtual celebration on our last day which will take place on Saturday, December 19, 2020. Classes will resume after the Nativity break, during the week of January 4, 2021.

The 2021 year also coincides with the Bicentennial Celebrations for the Independence of Greece-1821-2021. There will be a number of events which will be held. One event is sponsored by the American Hellenic Foundation of Western Pennsylvania and the Greek Room Committee called "Bridges of White and Blue." 


