

#### THE PHILOPTOCHOS OF ST. NICHOLAS will celebrate the CUTTING OF THE

**VASILOPITA** in honor of ST. BASIL TODAY. While Fr. Christopher will cut a single loaf as usual during the ceremony, the rest of the bread will be cut and bagged for the faithful to take along with their blessed bread cubes (antidoron) at the end of services. Due to COVID-19, the usual practice of calling the leaders or representatives of various organizations to come forward will not be followed. However, donations will gladly be accepted. They can also be mailed to St. Nicholas Philoptochos at the church address: 419 S. Dithridge St, Pittsburgh PA 15213. Proceeds will benefit St. Basil Academy.

ALSO: HOUSE BLESSINGS this year will still take place beginning on January 6, but will of necessity be different from the past. The priest will stay OUTSIDE while reciting the prayers and bless the front of the house, and then leave a bottle of Holy Water for the family to use in blessing the interior. If you would like to have your house blessed, please call the Church Office (412-682-3866) and leave a message for Fr. Christopher (extension 2) with your name and the names of everyone living in your house, as well as your address and phone number. Father will let you know when he plans to come. While you do not have to be home for the prayer service to take place, it would be best if you were.

#### SPECIAL HYMNS OF THE DAY (SMALL ENTRANCE):

First to be heard at the Small Entrance is the Resurrection Hymn in Tone 5: Let us worship the Word who is unoriginate with the Father and the Spirit, and from a Virgin was born for our salvation, O believers, and let us sing His praise. For in His goodness He was pleased to ascend the Cross in the flesh, and to undergo death, and to raise up those who had died, by His glorious Resurrection. [SD]

Then, the usual Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) in Tone 2 is chanted:

Δεῦτε προσκυνήσωμεν καὶ προσπέσωμεν Χριστῷ. Σῶσον ἡμᾶς Υἱὲ Θεοῦ, ὁ ἀναστὰς ἐκ νεκρῶν , ψάλλοντάς σοι Ἀλληλούϊα. "Come let us worship and fall down before Christ. Save us O Son of God, who arose from the dead. We sing to you, Alleluia."

The Resurrection Apolytikion is repeated, followed by the hymn for the Forefeast of Theophany: Έτοιμάζου Ζαβουλῶν, καὶ εὐτρεπίζου Νεφθαλείμ. Ἰορδάνη ποταμέ, στήθι ὑπόδεξαι σκιρτῶν, τοῦ βαπτισθῆναι ἐρχόμενον τὸν Δεσπότην. Ἁγάλλου ὁ Ἁδὰμ σὺν τὴ Προμήτορι, μὴ κρύπτετε ἑαυτούς, ὡς ἐν Παραδείσῳ τὸ πρίν, καὶ γὰρ γυμνοὺς ἰδὼν ὑμᾶς ἐπέφανεν, ἵνα ἐνδύσῃ τὴν πρώτην στολήν, Χριστὸς ἐφάνη, τὴν πᾶσαν κτίσιν, θέλων ἀνακαινίσαι. Ο Zebulon, prepare, and be ready, Naphtali. Jordan River, hold your course, and exultantly receive the Master who is coming to be baptized. Adam leap for joy with Eve the Foremother. No longer hide yourselves, as once in Paradise; for having seen you naked He has appeared to clothe you in your former vesture. The Christ has appeared, wishing to renew the entire creation.

Then, we hear the Apolytikion for the patron saint of our Church:

Κανόνα πίστεως καὶ εἰκόνα πραότητος, ἐγκρατείας Διδάσκαλον, ἀνέδειξέ σε τῇ ποίμνῃ σου, ἡ τῶν πραγμάτων ἀλήθεια· διὰ τοῦτο ἐκτήσω τῇ ταπεινώσει τὰ ὑψηλά, τῇ πτωχείᾳ τὰ πλούσια, Πάτερ Ἱεράρχα Νικόλαε· πρέσβευε Χριστῷ τῷ Θεῷ, σωθῆναι τὰς ψυχὰς ἡμῶν. The truth of things has revealed you to your flock as a rule of faith, an icon of meekness, and a teacher of temperance; for this cause you have achieved the heights by humility, riches by poverty. O Father and Hierarch Nicholas, intercede with Christ God that our souls be saved.

Finally, the Kontakion in Tone 4 for the Forefeast of Theophany is chanted:

Έν τοῖς ῥείθροις σήμερον τοῦ Ἰορδάνου, γεγονῶς ὁ Κύριος, τῷ Ἰωάννη ἐκβοᾳ. Μὴ δειλιάσης βαπτίσαι με, σῷσαι γὰρ ἥκω, Ἀδὰμ τὸν πρωτόπλαστον. In the running waters of the Jordan River, on this day the Lord of all cries to John: Be not afraid and hesitate not to baptize me, for I am come to save Adam, the first-formed man.

**Today's Epistle Reading: 2 Timothy 4: 5-8.** Timothy, my son, always be steady, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfil your ministry. For I am already on the point of being sacrificed; the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that Day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved his appearing. [RSV]

Today's Gospel reading: Mark 1: 1-8. The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. As it is written in Isaiah the prophet, 'Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who shall prepare your way; the voice of one crying in the wilderness: prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.' John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And there went out to him all the country of Judea, and all the people of Jerusalem; and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, and had a leather girdle around his waist, and ate locusts and wild honey. And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the thong of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." [RSV]

# **Sound System Update**

Parish Council has approved the audio and video upgrade proposal by Kinetics AV and the new system has been ordered. The committee has discussed recommendations from 4 vendors and reviewed their proposals before deciding that Kinetics AV will provide the best improvement and service. The effort will include new microphones, speakers, sound board, and video camera and will be digitally balanced to compensate for the poor acoustics of the church. Unfortunately, installation will not be until late January.

We greatly appreciate the donations from our parishioners who funded this major improvement to our Cathedral. This sound system contract does not address improving the Wi-Fi signal throughout the facility because that effort involves a different set of vendors. The committee is currently obtaining proposals for the Wi-Fi and we are still seeking donations for this last phase of the project.
