

Orthros Gospel for the Feast: John 20: 19-23. PLEASE NOTE: There is no fasting all this week.

(SMALL ENTRANCE):

The first hymn chanted at the Small Entrance is the troparion for Pentecost (Tone 8): Εὐλογητὸς εἶ, Χριστὲ ὁ Θεὸς ἡμῶν, ὁ πανσόφους τοὺς ἁλιεῖς ἀναδείξας, καταπέμψας αὐτοῖς τὸ Πνεῦμα τὸ ἄγιον, καὶ δι' αὐτῶν, τὴν οἰκουμένην σαγηνεύσας, φιλάνθοωπε, δόξα σοι. Blessed are You, O Christ our God. You made the fishermen all-wise, by sending down upon them the Holy Spirit, and through them, You drew the world into Your net. O Lover of mankind, glory to You.

After the procession with the Gospel the special **Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn)** in Tone 2 is chanted: Ύψώθητι, Κύριε, ἐν τῆ δυνάμει σου, ἄσωμεν καὶ ψαλοῦμεν τὰς δυναστείας σου. Σῶσον ἡμᾶς Υἱὲ Θεοῦ, Σῶσον ἡμᾶς, Παράκλητε ἀγαθέ, ψάλλοντάς σοι Ἀλληλούϊα. Be exalted, O Lord, in your power; we will sing and praise your mighty deeds. Save us, O good Comforter. We sing to You, Alleluia.


As the Clergy reenter the Sanctuary, the hymn for Pentecost is repeated. Then comes the Kontakion of the feast: Ότε καταβάς τὰς γλώσσας συνέχεε, διεμέριζεν ἔθνη ὁ Ὑψιστος· ὅτε τοῦ πυρὸς τὰς γλώσσας διένειμεν, εἰς ἑνότητα πάντας ἐκάλεσε, καὶ συμφώνως δοξάζομεν τὸ πανάγιον Πνεῦμα.

When the Most High God came down and confused the tongues, * He divided the nations. When He distributed the tongues of fire, * He called all to unity. And with one voice we glorify the all-holy Spirit.

EPISTLE: Acts 2: 1-11. When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontos and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God.

GOSPEL: John 7: 37-52; 8: 12. On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as the scripture has said, 'Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water.'" Now this he said about the Spirit, which those who believed in him were to receive; for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified. When they heard these words, some of the people said, "This is really the prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee? Has not the scripture said that the Christ is descended from David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" So there was a division among the people over him. Some of them wanted to arrest him, but no one laid hands on him. The officers then went back to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring him?" The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this man!" The Pharisees answered them, "Are you led astray, you also? Have any of the authorities or of the Pharisees believed in him? But this crowd, who do not know the law, are accursed." Nikodemos, who had gone to him before, and who was one of them, said to them, "Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and you will see that no prophet is to rise from Galilee." Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

Storm Damage at St. Nicholas Cathedral

The severe storm that passed through our area last Sunday night was too much for Pittsburgh's drainage system to handle. Flood water backed out of most of the drains on the lower levels. The small hall, storage rooms, boiler room, and the lobby outside the small hall were all filled with several inches of water. In addition, water backed out of the restrooms partially covering the lobby outside the large hall. Fortunately, much of this water poured into the elevator shaft and did not spread into the large hall.

The restoration company has had a crew at St. Nicholas all week emptying the storage areas, employing lots of drying fans, and cutting out damaged surfaces. The most significant damage has been the large baseboards and corresponding drywall around the small hall and both lobbies. These are being cut out and removed. The insurance adjuster has visited several times during the week overseeing the effort, though it is too early to know the costs for cleanup and repair.

The storm also badly damaged one of our large oak trees along Forbes Avenue (the one closest to Craig Street). At least half of the branches came down, but, fortunately, fell onto Forbes and did not hit our building. A tree specialist is being scheduled to determine if the remaining branches are cracked and how much of the tree might need to come down.
