

SPECIAL HYMNS OF THE DAY:

The first hymn chanted at the Small Entrance is the Festal Apolytikion for Pascha in Tone 5: Χριστός ἀνέστη ἐκ νεκρῶν, θανάτῳ θάνατον πατήσας, καί τοῖς ἐν τοῖς μνήμασι ζωήν χαρισάμενος Christ is risen from the dead, by death, trampling down upon death, and to those in the tombs He has granted life.

At the Entrance with the Gospel, the special Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) for Pascha is chanted: Έν Ἐκκλησίαις εὐλογεῖτε τόν Θεόν, Κύριον ἐκ πηγῶν Ἰσραήλ. Σῶσον ἡμᾶς, Υἰέ Θεοῦ, ὁ ἀναστάς ἐκ νεκρῶν, ψάλλοντάς σοι, Ἀλληλούϊα.

In the congregations bless God the Lord, from the springs of Israel. Save us O Son of God, who did rise from the dead, we sing to you Alleluia.

Then, we hear "Christ is Risen" once again, followed by the following hymn from the Orthros: Προλαβοῦσαι τὸν ὄρθρον αἱ περὶ Μαριάμ, καὶ εὑροῦσαι τὸν λίθον ἀποκυλισθέντα τοῦ μνήματος, ἤκουον ἐκ τοῦ Ἁγγέλου. Τὸν ἐν φωτὶ ἀιδίφ ὑπάρχοντα, μετὰ νεκρῶν τί ζητεῖτε ὡς ἄνθρωπον; βλέπετε τὰ ἐντάφια σπάργανα. δράμετε, καὶ τῷ κόσμῷ κηρύξατε, ὡς ἠγέρθη ὁ Κύριος, θανατώσας τὸν θάνατον. ὅτι ὑπάρχει Θεοῦ Υίός, τοῦ σῷζοντος τὸ γένος τῶν ἀνθρώπων.

When Mary and the women with her had come before dawn, they found that the stone had been rolled away from the sepulcher. They heard from the Angel, "Why do you seek among the dead, as a mortal man, the One who exists in everlasting light? See the grave clothes in the sepulcher. Run and proclaim to the world that the Lord has risen and put death to death; for He is the Son of God who saves the human race."

Then, the Paschal Kontakion is heard:

Εἰ καὶ ἐν τάφῷ κατῆλθες Ἀθάνατε, ἀλλὰ τοῦ ἄδου καθεῖλες τὴν δύναμιν· καὶ ἀνέστης ὡς νικητής, Χριστὲ ὁ Θεός, γυναιξὶ Μυροφόροις φθεγξάμενος, Χαίρετε, καὶ τοῖς σοῖς Ἀποστόλοις εἰρήνην δωρούμενος, ὁ τοῖς πεσοῦσι παρέχων ἀνάστασιν.

Though You went down into the tomb, O Immortal One, yet You brought down the dominion of Hades; and You rose as the victor, O Christ our God; and You called out "Rejoice" to the Myrrh-bearing women, and gave peace to Your Apostles, O Lord who to the fallen grants resurrection.

Instead of "Holy God" (the Trisagion Hymn), we chant the Baptismal Hymn: Όσοι εἰς Χριστὸν ἐβαπτίσθητε, Χριστὸν ἐνεδύσασθε. Ἀλληλούϊα. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. Alleluia.

Instead of the usual "Axion Estin" to the Theotokos after the consecration of the Gifts, we hear: Ὁ Ἀγγελος ἐβόα τὴ κεχαριτωμένη, Ἁγνὴ Παρθένε, χαῖρε, καὶ πάλιν ἐρῶ, χαῖρε, ὁ σὸς Υίὸς ἀνέστη τριήμερος ἐκ τάφου. Φωτίζου, φωτίζου ἡ νέα Ἱερουσαλήμ· ἡ γὰρ δόξα Κυρίου ἐπὶ σὲ ἀνέτειλε. Χόρευε νῦν καὶ ἀγάλλου, Σιών, σὸ δέ, ἀγνή, τέρπου, Θεοτόκε, ἐν τῆ ἐγέρσει τοῦ τόκου σου.

The Angel cried aloud to the Lady full of grace: Rejoice, O pure Virgin; and again I say rejoice. Your Son has resurrected from the grave on the third day. Shine, shine, O New Jerusalem; for the glory of the Lord has dawned upon you. Dance now for joy, O Zion, and be glad. And you, O all-pure Theotokos, delight in the arising of the One you bore.

APOSTOLIC READING: Acts 1: 1-8: In the first book, O Theophilos, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commandment through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. To them he presented himself alive after his passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days, and speaking of the kingdom of God. And while staying with them he charged them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me, for John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit." So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom of Israel?" He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has fixed by his own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth." [RSV]

GOSPEL: John 1: 1-17: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God; all things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was ohn. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness to the light. The true light that enlightens every man was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world knew him not. He came to his own home, and his own people received him not. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God; who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father. (John bore witness to him, and cried, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, for he was before me.' ") And from his fullness have we all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. [RSV]





Thank you all for the success we had with this year's Camp Fundraiser. The children of St. Nicholas can't thank you enough for all the support, contributions, and generous donations.





ARCHPASTORAL REFLECTION: HOPE RISES FROM THE TOMB

As we bask in the glory of the resurrection and greet one another with a joy appropriate for this, the feast of feasts, we must always remember that our salvation is accomplished and completed when Christ rises from the tomb – but it is begun when He is lifted up on



the cross. If it concludes in glory and triumph, our salvation originates in shame and pain. We should linger over this fact for a while, and not pass over it too quickly, because it reminds us that Christ has shared and endured all the worst of human suffering and has conquered death by dying Himself.

As we struggle to care for ailing family members who have no hope of recovery; as we endure in ourselves the habits of a lifetime that seem so hard to break; as we wrestle with the sins of the world that seem to lead inexorably to crime and to injustice and, now, even to war, we must remember that we believe in a God who has met us at our worst, and has turned our darkness into his light.

Our struggles and our sadness are not meaningless and they are not endured alone. Even if we stand in the pit of despair, we must seek for illumination in the shadows, and find Christ in valley of death. We do not believe in a God who ignores our suffering or who befriends only the mighty and the powerful, but in a God who promised us, "In this world you have trouble, but take heart, I have overcome the world (John 16:33)."

HOLY UNMERCENARIES MEDICAL SOCIETY FOUNDED

The Holy Unmercenaries Medical Society (HUMS) of the Metropolis of Pittsburgh has been founded with the mission to "be a fellowship"



of healthcare professionals within the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Pittsburgh. Through the spiritual development and fellowship of its members, the society aspires to give freely unto others the love, mercy and healing ministry of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, through worship, education, service and philanthropy."



Patron saints of the group include Sts. Panteleimon, Cosmas and Damianos and others, who as healers, received no payment for their service and who healed not only with medicine, but also with faith. Membership is open to healthcare professionals and students. HUMS of the Metropolis of Pittsburgh was modeled after the HUMS in the Metropolis of Atlanta.

The Annunciation Akron Chapter (http://annunciationakron.org/hums) is the pilot chapter in our metropolis. The Akron

Board of Directors currently also serves as the Board the Metropolis organization (which will expand with the

founding of other parish chapters). Over the last three years, it has hosted annual HUMS parish retreats, conducted book studies related to faith and healing, sponsored webinars on COVID-19, and held a Blessing of the Hands Service.

Our goal is to have parish or regional chapters all across the Metropolis—to support the vital work of all our healthcare professionals!
