

SPECIAL HYMNS OF THE DAY (SMALL ENTRANCE):

The first hymn we hear at the Small Entrance is the Resurrection Apolytikion in the Tone of the week (1): Ότε κατῆλθες πρὸς τὸν θάνατον, ἡ ζωὴ ἡ ἀθάνατος, τότε τὸν Ἅδην ἐνέκρωσας τῇ ἀστραπῇ τῆς Θεότητος· ὅτε δὲ καὶ τοὺς τεθνεῶτας ἐκ τῶν καταχθονίων ἀνέστησας, πᾶσαι αἱ δυνάμεις τῶν ἐπουρανίων ἐκραύγαζον· Ζωοδότα Χριστὲ ὁ Θεὸς ἡμῶν, δόξα σοι.

When You descended unto death, O Lord who yourself are immortal Life, then did You mortify Hades by the lightning flash of Your Divinity. Also when You raised the dead the netherworld, all the Powers of the heavens were crying out: O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory to You. [SD]

At the procession with the Gospel the usual Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) in Tone 2 is chanted: Δεῦτε προσκυνήσωμεν καὶ προσπέσωμεν Χριστῷ. Σῶσον ἡμᾶς Υὶὲ Θεοῦ, ὁ ἀναστὰς ἐκ νεκρῶν, ψάλλοντάς σοι Ἀλληλούϊα. "Come let us worship and fall down before Christ. Save us O Son of God, who arose from the dead. We sing to you, Alleluia."

As the Clergy enter back into the Sanctuary, we hear the Resurrection hymn again. Following this, we chant the Hymn for St. Nicholas (Tone 4):

Κανόνα πίστεως καὶ εἰκόνα πραότητος, ἐγκρατείας Διδάσκαλον, ἀνέδειξέ σε τῇ ποίμνῃ σου, ἡ τῶν πραγμάτων ἀλήθεια: διὰ τοῦτο ἐκτήσω τῇ ταπεινώσει τὰ ὑψηλά, τῇ πτωχείᾳ τὰ πλούσια, Πάτερ Ἱεράρχα Νικόλαε: πρέσβευε Χριστῷ τῷ Θεῷ, σωθῆναι τὰς ψυχὰς ἡμῶν. The truth of things have revealed you to your flock as a rule of faith, an icon of meekness, and a teacher of temperance; for this cause you have achieved the heights by humility, riches by poverty. O Father and Hierarch Nicholas, intercede with Christ God that our souls be saved.

Finally, we hear the Kontakion for the upcoming feast of the Nativity of the Theotokos: Ἰωακεὶμ καὶ Ἄννα ὀνειδισμοῦ ἀτεκνίας, καὶ Ἀδὰμ καὶ Εὕα, ἐκ τῆς φθορᾶς τοῦ θανάτου, ἠλευθερώθησαν, Ἅχραντε, ἐν τῇ ἀγίᾳ γεννήσει σου· αὐτὴν ἐορτάζει καὶ ὁ λαός σου, ἐνοχῆς τῶν πταισμάτων, λυτρωθεὶς ἐν τῷ κράζειν σοι· Ἡ στεῖρα τίκτει τὴν Θεοτόκον, καὶ τροφὸν τῆς ζωῆς ἡμῶν.

Both Joachim and Anna from their sterility's stigma, and Adam and Eve from their mortality's ruin, have been set free, O immaculate Maid, by your holy nativity. For this do your people hold celebration, redeemed from the guilt of transgression as they cry to you, "The barren one bears the Theotokos, the nourisher of our Life." [GKD]

EPISTLE: I Corinthians 9:2-12: Brethren, you are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord. This is my defense to those who would examine me. Do we not have the right to our food and drink? Do we not have the right to be accompanied by a wife, as the other apostles and the brothers of the Lord and Cephas? Or is it only Barnabas and I who have no right to refrain from working for a living? Who serves as a soldier at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard without eating any of its fruit? Who tends a flock without getting some of the milk? Do I say this on human authority? It was written for our sake, because the plowman should plow in hope and the thresher thresh in hope of a share in the crop. If we have sown spiritual good among you, is it too much if we reap your material benefits? If others share this rightful claim upon you, do not we still more? Nevertheless, we have not made use of this right, but we endure anything rather than put an obstacle in the way of the gospel of Christ. [RSV]

GOSPEL: Matthew 17: 14-23. The Lord said this parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who

wished to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the reckoning, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents; and as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. So the servant fell on his knees, imploring him, 'Lord, have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' And out of pity for him the lord of that servant released him and forgave him the debt. But that same servant, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred


denarii; and seizing him by the throat he said, 'Pay what you owe.' So his fellow servant fell down and besought him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' He refused and went and put him in prison till he should pay the debt. When his fellow servants saw what had taken place, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave

you all that debt because you besought me; and should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?' And in anger his lord delivered him to the jailors, till he should pay all his debt. So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart." [RSV]

YOUTH SAFETY WORKERS

Who is considered a Youth Safety Worker?

- All Clergymen (Bishops/Priests/Deacons, both Active & Retired)
- Pastoral Assistants & Youth Directors
- People assisting, in any ministry, where the participants are under 18 years of age or in high school, whichever is later.
 - Including Parish Youth Safety Administrators, Church School Teachers, Dance Directors, Greek School Teachers, Youth Advisors (including Chaperones & Drivers)
 - Even... Parents who occasionally help-out, but are alone with other people's children.

Each Youth Safety Worker is required to register yearly with the church.

Registration is available through the church office. In addition, all Youth Safety Workers are required to take two courses in Armatus Praesidium (online training platform) annually and to complete a background check every other year.

https://armatus2.praesidiuminc.com/armatusUser/login. The first course, Youth Safety, has two parts. The second course, Youth Worker Regulations, has one part. Prompt completion is necessary as one cannot participate in any youth programs without being registered, having a background check, having PA state clearances, and completing the two courses.

The Quecreek Mine disaster took place in Somerset County, PA, when nine miners were trapped underground for over 77 hours from July 24 to 28, 2002. Hear the fascinating step-by-step miraculous rescue of all nine miners.

Cathedral Ceiling Damage Update, August 25

The maintenance committee has had two inspections of the sanctuary ceiling by the engineering firm Wiss, Janney, Elstner & Associates, a large, nation-wide, company specializing in structural and architectural analysis of construction-related problems. We are waiting for their report and recommendations on how to test the remainder of the ceiling and recommendation on how to repair. This report is expected any day (it is already late).

In our discussion with the engineering firm, the plaster had slow growing cracks emanating from ceiling cutouts, such as lights and ducts that separated the plaster from the underlying lath board. They have seen this failure before in buildings of this vintage (120 years old). From these discussions and discussions with other contractors, this is the current expectation of how the repair work will proceed.

- 1. Protect all items in the church that could be damaged by a falling chunk of plaster including the Bishop's Throne, altar screen, pulpit, and stained glass. Some of these will have hard enclosures built.
- 2. Erect scaffolding under the entire high portion of the ceiling
- 3. Test the structural integrity of the plaster across the entire ceiling.
 - If an area has a good bond, install mechanical supports to prevent future problems
 - If an area has cracked away from the lath board, remove the damaged plaster
- 4. Replaster both the area that has fallen and areas where cracked plaster was removed. Several coats of plaster will be required. The newly plastered areas will use modern steel lath panels which provides much better structural support.
- 5. Paint the ceiling
- 6. Remove scaffolding and all protective enclosures and coverings.
- 7. Clean dust from the entire church.

We have been doing much of the groundwork in preparation of the final direction from the engineering report. Two scaffolding companies have been on-site to review the requirements and have provided quotes. We have also had contractors on-site who could provide the plastering and painting.

We don't know how expensive the repair will be. It will depend on how large the required repair area will be and the specifics of the repair contained in the engineering report. But we do know it will be very expensive; the scaffolding alone will cost more than \$75,000. To start financing the project, St. Nicholas Cathedral has a healthy balance in the Building Fund plus the income earned from the Foundation Fund could be appropriated for this project. Beyond that, we are exploring other financing options including obtaining a mortgage, initiating a fundraising campaign, and principal withdrawals from the Foundation Fund.

The spiritual and social life of the parish will continue as usual during this church repair. Divine Liturgy has been in the small hall. All Religious and Greek Education classes and youth activities are proceeding as usual in September. And the church picnic is going forward on September 11. That said, we will expedite the repair process as much as possible, while ensuring that we have a ceiling that will easily last the next 100 years.


