TODAY'S SPECIAL HYMNS AND READINGS:

First to be heard at the Small Entrance is the Resurrection Hymn in this week's Mode (Plagal Second):

Ἀγγελικαὶ δυνάμεις ἐπὶ τὸ μνήμά σου, καὶ οἱ φυλάσσοντες ἀπενεκρώθησαν, καὶ ἴστατο Μαρία ἐν τῷ τάφῳ, ζητοῦσα τὸ ἄχραντόν σου σῶμα. Ἐσκύλευσας τὸν Ἄδην, μὴ πειρασθεὶς ὑπ' αὐτοῦ, ὑπήντησας τῇ Παρθένῳ, δωρούμενος τὴν ζωὴν, ὁ ἀναστὰς ἐκ τῶν νεκρῶν, Κύριε δόξα σοι. When the angelic powers appeared at Your grave, the soldiers guarding it feared and became as dead. And standing by the sepulcher was Mary who was seeking Your immaculate body. You devastated Hades, not afflicted by it. You went to meet the Virgin, and granted eternal life. You resurrected from the dead. O Lord, glory to You. [SD]

Next, the clergy chant the Entrance Hymn as they stand facing the Altar at the Small Entrance: Δεῦτε

ροσκυνήσωμεν καὶ προσπέσωμεν Χριστῷ. Σῶσον ἡμᾶς Υἱὲ Θεοῦ, ὁ ἀναστὰς ἐκ νεκρῶν, ψάλλοντάς σοι, Ἀλληλούϊα. Come, let us worship and bow down before Christ. Save us, O Son of God, risen from the dead. We sing to You, Alleluia.

This is followed by the special hymn for the Forefeast of the Entrance of the Theotokos: Χαρὰν προμνηστεύεται, σήμερον Ἄννα ἡμῖν, τῆς λύπης ἀντίθετον, καρπὸν βλαστήσασα, τὴν μόνην Ἀειπάρθενον· ἦν περ δὴ καὶ προσάγει, τὰς εὐχὰς ἐκπληροῦσα, σήμερον γηθομένη, τῷ Ναῶ τοῦ Κυρίου, ὡς ὄντως ναὸν τοῦ Θεοῦ Λόγου, καὶ Μητέρα ἀγνήν. Today righteous Anna solicits joy for us all, the opposite of pain and sorrow, having brought forth her fruit, the only ever-virgin Maid; and today in fulfillment of her prayer and her promise, to the Temple of the Lord she joyfully leads her who is truly the temple and pure Mother of God the Word. The Apolytikion for St. Nicholas, our Patron, is heard next: Κανόνα πίστεως καὶ εἰκόνα πραότητος, ἐγκρατείας Διδάσκαλον, ἀνέδειξέ σε τῇ ποιμνῇ σου, ἢ τῶν πραγμάτων ἀλήθεια· διὰ τοῦτο ἐκτήσω τῇ ταπεινώσει τὰ ὑψηλά, τῇ πτωχείᾳ τὰ πλούσια, Πάτερ Ἱεράρχα Νικόλαε· πρέσβευε Χριστῷ τῷ Θεῷ, σωθῆναι τὰς ψυχὰς ἡμῶν. The truth of things has revealed you to your flock as a rule of faith, an icon of meekness, and a teacher of temperance; for this cause you have achieved the heights by humility, riches by poverty. O Father and Hierarch Nicholas, intercede with Christ God that our souls be saved.

Finally, the Kontakion for the Forefeast is chanted: Εὐφροσύνης σήμερον, ἡ οἰκουμένη, ἐπληρώθη ἅπασα, ἐν τῇ εὐσήμερῳ Ἑορτῇ, τῆς Θεοτόκου κραυγάζουσα· Αὕτη ὑπάρχει, σκηνὴ ἐπουράνιος. On this day the whole wide world is filled completely with great joy and merriment on the occasion of the feast of the Theotokos and cries aloud: "She is the heavenly tabernacle indeed." [SD]

TODAY'S EPISTLE: Ephesians 2:4-10. Ἀδελφοί, ὁ Θεὸς πλούσιος ὢν ἐν ἐλέει, διὰ τὴν πολλὴν ἀγάπην αὐτοῦ ἦν ἡγάπησεν ἡμᾶς, καὶ ὄντας ἡμᾶς νεκροὺς τοῖς παραπτώμασιν συνεζωοποίησεν τῷ Χριστῷ· χάριτί ἐστε σεσωσμένοι· καὶ συνήγειρεν καὶ συνεκάθισεν ἐν τοῖς ἐπουρανίοις ἐν Χριστῷ Ἰησοῦ, ἵνα ἐνδείξηται ἐν τοῖς αἰῶσι τοῖς ἐπερχομένοις τὸν ὑπερβάλλοντα πλοῦτον τῆς χάριτος αὐτοῦ ἐν χρηστότητι ἐφ' ἡμᾶς ἐν Χριστῷ Ἰησοῦ. Τῇ γὰρ χάριτί ἐστε σεσωσμένοι διὰ τῆς πίστεως· καὶ τοῦτο οὐκ ἐξ ὑμῶν, Θεοῦ τὸ δῶρον· οὐκ ἐξ ἔργων, ἵνα μή τις καυχῆσθαι. Αὐτοῦ γὰρ ἐσμεν ποίημα, κτισθέντες ἐν Χριστῷ Ἰησοῦ ἐπὶ ἔργοις ἀγαθοῖς οἷς προητοίμασεν ὁ Θεὸς ἵνα ἐν αὐτοῖς περιπατήσωμεν.

Brethren, God who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up with him, and made us sit with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not your own doing, it is the gift of God: not because of works, lest any man should boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them. [RSV]

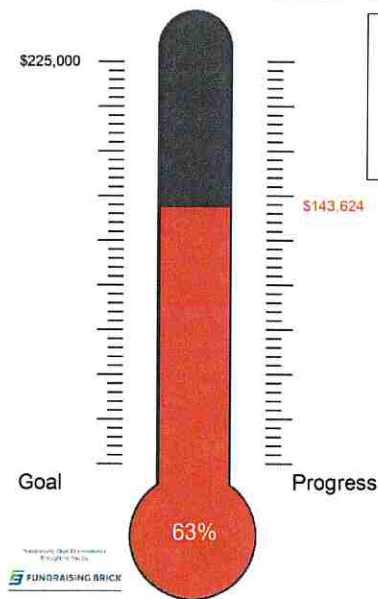
TODAY'S GOSPEL READING: LUKE 12: 16-21. Εἶπεν ὁ Κύριος τὴν παραβολὴν ταύτην· Ἄνθρωπου τινὸς πλουσίου εὐφώρησεν ἡ χώρα· καὶ διελογίζετο ἐν ἑαυτῷ λέγων· τί ποιήσω, ὅτι οὐκ ἔχω ποῦ συνάξω τοὺς καρπούς μου; καὶ εἶπε· τοῦτο ποιήσω· καθελῶ μου τὰς ἀποθήκας καὶ μείζονας οἰκοδομήσω, καὶ συνάξω ἐκεῖ πάντα τὰ γεννήματά μου καὶ τὰ ἀγαθὰ μου, καὶ ἐρῶ τῇ ψυχῇ μου· ψυχὴ, ἔχεις πολλὰ ἀγαθὰ κείμενα εἰς ἔτη πολλά· ἀναπαύου, φάγε, πίε, εὐφραίνου. εἶπε δὲ αὐτῷ ὁ Θεός· ἄφρον, ταύτη τῇ νυκτὶ τὴν ψυχὴν σου ἀπαιτοῦσιν ἀπὸ σοῦ· ἃ δὲ ἠτοίμασας τί νῦν ἔσται; οὕτως ὁ θησαυρίζων ἑαυτῷ καὶ μὴ εἰς Θεὸν πλουτῶν. Ταῦτα λέγων ἐφώνει· Ὁ ἔχων ὧτα ἀκούειν, ἀκουέτω.

The Lord said this parable: "The land of a rich man brought forth plentifully; and he thought to himself, 'What shall I do, for I have nowhere to store my crops?' And he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns, and build larger ones; and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; take your ease, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." As he said these things, he cried out: "He who has ears to hear, let him hear." [RSV]

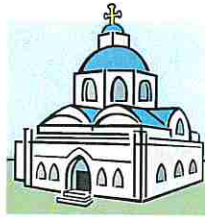

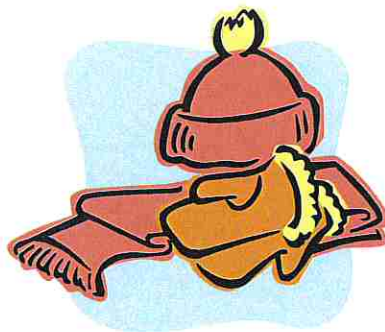

Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

St. Nicholas Cathedral, as a building, has been a real blessing to our community for many decades – ever since it was purchased from a Congregationalist congregation in the early 1920's. The structure itself has been recognized as a Historical Landmark by the Pittsburgh History and Landmark Foundation. The beauty of our worship space makes a striking impression on every visitor who sees it. There is something about it that makes it unique – special. However, as most of you are by now aware, we are facing a serious challenge with the beautiful ceiling of our sanctuary. And we need your help.

As you may recall, it is divided into square sections called *coffers*, that are separated by beautiful moldings which are decorated in the “Greek Revival” classical style, consistent with the original decoration and architecture of the building. In late July, a sizable portion of one of the ceiling coffers fell and smashed into tiny pieces (thank God, no one was present at the time). The Parish Council immediately realized the seriousness of this situation, which was confirmed when an engineering firm with a specialty in this area was called in to inspect the entire ceiling. Numerous other cracks and sags in the coffers were discovered – all of which could pose a danger to anyone who might find themselves in the room, if and when any of these other sections should happen to fall.

There is only one remedy: every one of the affected coffers must be replaced or repaired before the room becomes safe for us to use again. This required the erection of a massive scaffold, so that every part of the ceiling can be properly inspected and repaired. It has taken a long time for this to happen, but this phase has finally finished. Now, the crew responsible for the plastering has arrived and begun its work using this same scaffolding. We still don't have a firm idea as to how long the repair work will take, because it depends on what is discovered, as each coffer is examined carefully over the coming weeks and the plaster replaced, if necessary.

Why did this happen? We must remind ourselves that our Church is 125 years old. Gravity and age have taken their toll. But the building is sound, and otherwise in good condition. The good news is that there is nothing involved with this challenge that cannot be remedied.

The bad news is that it is going to be very expensive. The Council has been told that right now, realistically, we are facing a bill of around \$400,000. The Parish Council has come up with a variety of ways to manage such a big expense. However, key to the success of the endeavor is the support of our entire community. That is where all of us come in.

Just as has happened with unexpected expenses or with the various projects to expand the physical plant in the past, so also, today, we are counting on the support of the entire St. Nicholas family in order to meet this new and unexpected challenge. Insurance will be of little help to us, because, as is the norm across the field in this regard, our policy does not pay for damages caused by "normal wear and tear" – which includes such things as 125-year-old ceilings that are sagging. It is up to us to rise to the occasion and contribute with our time, talent, and treasure, in order to raise the money and/or donate our own funds to this critical project, so that we can safely move back into our beautiful sanctuary as soon as possible. All of us can find some way to help.

I realize that this is also the season when we send out our Stewardship cards to meet our budget for the New Year. It may seem troublesome to ask for two different long-term, sizable commitments at one time. But, please keep in mind that these are two different things. One (Stewardship) is how we support our parish and make it possible, on an ongoing, monthly basis to meet our budget and keep the doors open, while the other (the fund-raising campaign) is being undertaken in order to address an emergency need such as this one, that is not expected to recur, and which is necessary to repair for safety's sake and for the survival of our parish as a worshipping community.

As a memento of this ceiling project, donors to the project and all their family members will be invited to sign a construction panel. This panel will be installed in or behind the new ceiling. It will act as a permanent connection between your family and your St. Nicholas Cathedral. Photos of this panel could be displayed at future celebrations marking milestones in the life of our parish. Also, for those who wish, engraved pavers can be installed in the existing circle in the parklet along Forbes Ave. Pavers are available at the \$1,250, \$2,500, \$5,000 and \$25,000 level. A pledged donation can be paid over a two-year period.

There are so many wonderful memories associated with the exceptionally beautiful sanctuary of our beloved St. Nicholas Cathedral. Weddings, baptisms, funerals, joy mixed with sorrow, sorrow overcome by joy, a sense of wonder that sometimes takes your breath away – all of this and more is the remarkable heritage that our forefathers and foremothers in their wisdom – and with much sacrifice – bequeathed to us – *for all time*.

Now, it is our turn to rise to the occasion. I invite you to join Presvytera Filitsa and myself, along with our Parish Council and so many other dedicated members of our community, in coming forward to assist us with both donations and fundraising efforts. Details as to how you can help can be found on the next page.

Through the prayers of our patron, St. Nicholas, may our endeavor be blessed, so that God's house – and our spiritual home – may be restored, and so that future generations may continue to worship and find sanctification here, with their hearts filled with love for our Savior and each other, for generations to come.

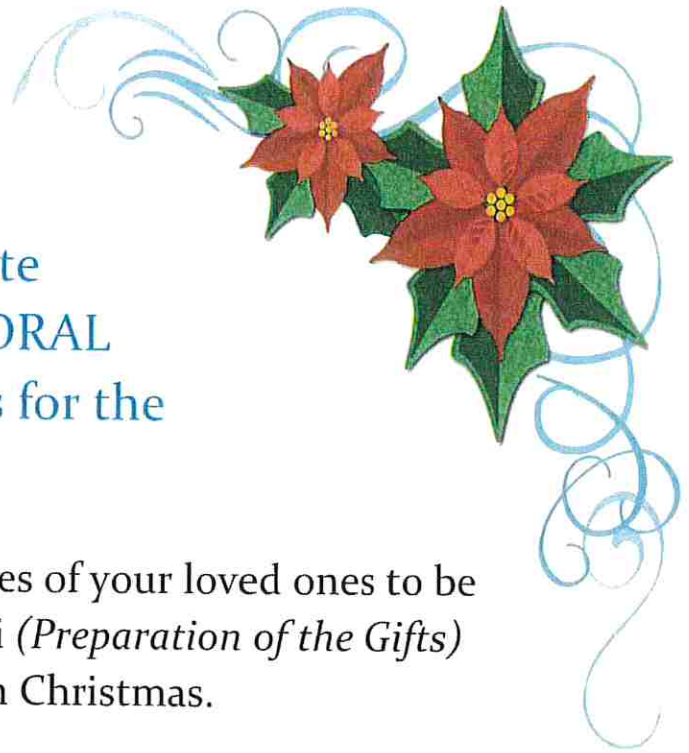
