


# FATHER'S MESSAGE

## ABUNDANT LIFE

The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly. – John 10:10

Beloved Sisters and Brothers in Christ: XPICTON ANENTH! CHRIST IS RISEN!

The words of Jesus quoted above come from the dialogue that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ had with "some of the Pharisees who were with him," just after he had created new eyes from clay and spit for a man born blind (John 9 – this miracle is recounted every year on the Fifth Sunday after Pascha). Some of them condemned Him, because He had performed this, one of His most remarkable miracles, on the Sabbath. They seemingly lacked any sense of pity or concern for this young man, a poor beggar, who had now been given a new lease on life because of our Lord's intervention. They could not see that: 1) God's mercy and compassion for His suffering children has no bounds and thus that acts of mercy are always welcome – even on the Sabbath; and, 2) Jesus Christ, as God's Son Incarnate, had a mission to fulfill during His brief time on earth, that is, to reveal who exactly He is, both by His words and His acts of mercy (miracles). Thus, in this context, He uses this opportunity not only to express His tender love for this suffering man but also responds, when asked, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"

Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be made manifest in him. We must work the works of Him who sent Me, while it is day; night comes, when no one can work. As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." (John 9:3-5).

Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, out of no other motive than that of infinite love for His suffering human children, is indeed our light and life, for He came not only to illumine us with His Good News (Gospel) of hope, but also to impart to us the gift of eternal life in God's presence, through His sacrificial death on the Cross, and His glorious Resurrection. This is the ultimate meaning of His promise of "abundant life:" it begins for most of us in infancy when we become members of Christ's Body, the Church, through our reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Chrismation, and Holy Communion. If we so desire it, this relationship can extend into every facet of our lives as we grow older. We become by grace what our Lord is by nature: God's children, His sons and daughters. This New Life in Christ has the potential to fill us with great joy even in this life, as we come to experience God's love and to share this love with others.

Many of us perhaps have been led to believe that the New Life in Christ is something we that should associate exclusively with what happens after we die: we go to heaven and receive our reward. In the meantime, too often, we just assume that life in this fallen world is and always will be a vale of tears, full of suffering and disappointment, punctuated perhaps by occasional flashes of joy and/or pleasure.

While it is true that no human being in this world (other than our Lord) is or ever has been immune from the realities of aging, illness, and, above all, death, this should not mean that we allow ourselves to succumb to an attitude of cynicism and hopelessness. For, when we look at our lives through the lens of our faith, we can see an entirely different picture: the promise of abundant life made real for us, not necessarily in the form of extravagant wealth or physical perfection, but rather, in terms of how we live out our faith in the context of our own everyday circumstances. A life need not last exceptionally long to have been meaningful; nor can the value of our life be reduced simply to what we have achieved in our careers or accumulated in our bank accounts. God's gift extends far beyond these markers of earthly success and has far more to do with our human treasure (relatives and friends) than with our worldly wealth.

While it is appropriate to strive and to make the best use possible of whatever gifts and talents God has given us, this alone does not fully define who we are. Our faith teaches us that we are, first and foremost, *God's beloved children by grace*.

That means that we are of infinite value in God's eyes. And our heavenly Father desires His earthly children to live forever in His presence, beginning with our life here on this earth, and extending into the world to come In His Kingdom.

We bring our Faith alive when we strive to experience its promises here in this beautiful world. A spirit of joy, of gratitude, of love for one another, of patience with each other, of generosity, of good will, and of caring for those in need and ignoring nobody, is called for. We must learn the meaning of mutual respect – that is, for ourselves first, flawed as we all are by the corrosive effects of sin – and then for all those around us. This is easy to do when our neighbor is young, attractive, and congenial. But it becomes harder, when we are dealing with those who can be stubborn and argumentative, or selfish and self-centered, or elderly and demanding. And yet, God loves us all the same – infinitely. How can we not be of help – not harm – to them in their time of need? How can we turn our backs on anybody? At the very least, perhaps we can assist them in finding the care appropriate for their needs.

Nor should we turn our backs on ourselves. We are also called to learn the importance of self-respect and of healthy love for self. You may find this statement baffling. Does our faith not emphasize the necessity for us to be willing to acknowledge at all times that we are sinners, so as not to fall into the even worse sin of pride? Yes, it does. When we do so, we are following in the footsteps of the Apostle Paul, who in 1 Timothy 1:15 called himself "the foremost of sinners," because he 'formerly blasphemed and persecuted and insulted [Christ]," by attacking Christian believers. But he never allowed this reality of his past to interfere with his present ministry, and he pursued his "mission to the Gentiles" with exceeding zeal and cheerful good will. This, also, is a good example for us to follow!

But we must be careful: this doesn't mean that we have found the perfect excuse to justify selfishness – nor for prideful or demeaning behavior towards others. And consider: does not one of our most ancient prayers before Holy Communion begin with, "I believe and confess, Lord, that You are truly the Christ, the Son of the living God, who came into the world to save **sinners**, of whom I am the first"? Yes, indeed! But this phrase was not intended as an excuse or carte blanche for sin. Rather, it is a didactic phrase that tries to teach us the degree to which we ought to pursue both honesty about our shortcomings and humility, in the presence of the Living God (Who can be found in the Communion Cup). By comparison to God's perfection and holiness, we will always fall short. (Nevertheless, we should still strive to "draw near" for Holy Communion as often as possible – not just once or twice a year, or decade.)

"Abundant life," then, means many things. We humbly follow on our spiritual journey, our pilgrimage, if you will, in the footsteps of giants, while not pretending that we belong in their company. We have as our leader the One who abolished the gates of Hell and opened the doors for us to the heavenly places – our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ, who rose from the dead, and ascended in glory into Heaven. We follow a road that is unique to ourselves, but that always leads, with the Lord's help, into the presence of our heavenly Father. Along the way, we will encounter illness, disappointment, and loss – but also moments of joy beyond imagining, when the Holy Spirit opens our eyes to the beauty and mystery of this, our glorious earthly home, full of life and love and hope, despite all of humanity's failings. In these moments, as when we receive Holy Communion, we experience a foretaste, an inkling, of what awaits us in God's heavenly Kingdom. Let us close with an excerpt from St. John Chrysostom's Paschal sermon.

Christ is Risen, and you, o death, are annihilated! Christ is Risen, and the evil ones are cast down! Christ is Risen, and the angels rejoice! Christ is Risen, and life is liberated!

Christ is Risen, and the tomb is emptied of its dead;

for Christ having risen from the dead, is become the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. To Him be Glory and Power forever and ever. Amen!

Who is considered a Youth Safety Worker?

All Clergymen (Bishops/Priests/Deacons, both Active & Retired) **Pastoral Assistants & Youth Directors** 

People assisting, in any ministry, where the participants are under 18 years of age or in high school, whichever is later.

Including Parish Youth Safety Administrators, Church School Teachers, Dance Directors, Greek School Teachers, Youth Advisors (including Chaperones & Drivers) and Parish Council. Even... Parents who occasionally help-out, but are alone with other

people's children.

Each Youth Safety Worker is required to register yearly with the church.

Registration is available through the church office. In addition, all Youth Safety Workers are required to take two courses (on-line training platform) annually and to complete a background check every other year.

The second course, Youth Worker Regulations, has one part. Prompt completion is necessary as one cannot participate in any youth programs without being registered, having a background check, having PA state clearances, and completing the two courses.


# FOOD FESTIVAL





# CEILING RESTORATION FUNDRAISING

# We have a lot of good news relating to fundraising for the ceiling restoration.

This year, the Vlahokerasiotes Manthyrea Educational Society dedicated all proceeds from their annual Makaronada Dinner / Dance toward the Restoration of our Cathedral Ceiling. The event was very successful with nearly 300 attending and clearing \$7,500. In addition, the Society generously matched these proceeds from their own funds, increasing their total donation to \$15,000. St. Nicholas Cathedral deeply appreciates this donation and the role that the descendants of Vlahokerasia always play in supporting St. Nicholas Cathedral.

Our insurance policy for property damage only covers the cost to repair the one spot of the ceiling that fell down. These types of policies generally do not cover the cost to repair deterioration due to age. Initially, the insurance company estimated the cost of repair at \$5,770, which is very, very low even for repairing the one collapsed spot. Then the insurance company subtracted deprecation and the deductible and sent us a check for \$2,400. We put together a package documenting that the cost to repair the collapsed part of the ceiling would be much higher than their estimate. They accepted our claim, and we recently received a check for an additional \$28,500!

Another big boost to our efforts to pay for the ceiling is that the Metropolis has reduced our Archdiocese assessment for 2023 by \$32,000. This was cone to assist with the parish's burden to pay for the ceiling damage. Members of the fundraising committee wrote a great letter to the Metropolis laying out the case for some relief this year to enable St. Nicholas to pay for the ceiling repair. And, it also helped our case that the Metropolis could see all of the capital campaign and fundraising activities that the parish was carrying out on its own to pay for the problem.

Finally, the capital campaign continues to do very well. Total pledges at this point are \$199,000 and \$194,000 of those pledges have been received to date. This year, the proceeds from the Festival Ad Book Committee are going toward the ceiling repair and the Ad Book Committee's preliminary reports are very encouraging.

Due to the outpouring of support from the parish, it is looking like we will have this entire ceiling restoration paid for very soon! Thank you for all of your efforts; the parish came through to do what was necessary to preserve our Cathedral and community. AXIOS!
