

FATHER'S MESSAGE

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As the calendar turns to a new month, and with it the dawn of the New Ecclesiastical Year - which we celebrate each year on September 1- we stand together at the threshold of new beginnings. The beginning of the New Ecclesiastical Year is also known as the Feast of the Indiction. An unfamiliar word to most, the term "indiction" hails from ancient Roman administrative practices and refers to a cycle of an annual tax which would be re-proclaimed every 15 years. The Orthodox Church adopted this cycle, marking the First of September as the commencement of its liturgical year. The theme of indiction beckons us to recognize the perpetual cycle of renewal within the Church, urging us to take stock of the past, looking introspectively at our own spiritual state, and all the while looking with hopeful anticipation to the future.

The indiction and the commencement of the new ecclesiastical year beautifully coincide with the onset of the school year, presenting both the young and young at heart within our community with an opportunity for growth, learning, and renewal. Each year at the start of the New Ecclesiastical Year, I am reminded me of the wise words from the Book of Ecclesiastes, "To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven." As our children and youth embark upon a new academic year, may this also mark a time for our entire community to embrace a new spiritual journey.

We chant in the Kontakion for the Feast of the Indiction: "Blessing our comings and goings throughout this year, and guide our works according to Your divine will." With this profound message and prayer, we are strengthened in the knowledge that as we step into the "newness of spirit" (Romans 7:6), God's guiding hand is ever present, overseeing our paths and decisions.

The call to a "newness of spirit" challenges us to not only welcome the new season, but also to journey forward with a rejuvenated heart and mindset. And so, as we traverse this ecclesiastical year together, let our collective efforts resonate in this spirit of newness in Christ. In each liturgical celebration, prayer, and act of service, may we embody this renewed spirit, constantly seeking to "grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18).


Welcome Brunch for College Students




A New Year starting September 1st!

Looking forward to seeing everyone at Church!



YOUTH SAFETY WORKERS

Who is considered a Youth Safety Worker?

All Clergymen (Bishops/Priests/Deacons, both

Active & Retired)

Pastoral Assistants & Youth Directors

People assisting, in any ministry, where the participants are under 18 years of age or in high

school, whichever is later.

Including Parish Youth Safety Administrators, Church School Teachers, Dance Directors, Greek School Teachers, Youth Advisors (including Chaperones & Drivers) and Parish Council.

Even... Parents who occasionally help-out, but are alone with other people's children.


Each Youth Safety Worker is required to register yearly with the church.

Registration is available through the church office. In addition, all Youth Safety Workers are required to take two courses (online training platform) annually and to complete a background check every other year.

Here is the website: Please register at https://ncsrisk.org/goarch/. The first course, Youth Safety, has two parts. The second course, Youth Worker Regulations, has one part. Prompt completion is necessary as one cannot participate in any youth programs without being registered, having a background check, having PA state clearances, and completing the two courses.

Sunday, September 17, 2023, the bells will start to ring again for the beginning of Church School with an Agiasmo (Blessings of the Water)!

As the Church School Director I am looking forward to working with my staff, teachers and **YOU** (the St. Nicholas parishioners) to enrich the lives of our children. St. Nicholas is our spiritual family and we all should take part in educating our **you**th (the **you** of tomorrow). As a community, we need to show our children our love and devotion to our Orthodox faith.

This year's Church School theme is "Living Our Orthodox Faith." Church School students are going to be encouraged to 'spread Orthodoxy' by showing they believe in Christ by being good stewards by using their time, talent, and treasure in Service to our Families, Friends, Neighbors, Community and Christ.

Every week your child is encouraged to bring "a donation" to Church School (this will help them learn the lesson of "stewardship"), plus, be assigned homework: Do something nice for someone!








NEW METROPOLIS CENTER UPDATE
