

The Meeting of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in the Temple (Υπαπαντή), commemorated on February 2, is a significant event in Christian tradition, described in the Gospel of Luke (2:22-40). This feast marks the day when Jesus Christ, as a baby, was presented to the Temple in Jerusalem by the Virgin Mary and Joseph, 40 days after his birth, in accordance with Jewish law. At the Temple, the righteous Elder Simeon, who had been promised by God that he would not die before seeing the Messiah, met Jesus. Simeon held Jesus in his arms and uttered a prophecy about Jesus' role in the salvation of both Jews and Gentiles. Another significant figure present was Saint Anna the Prophetess, an 84-year-old widow, who recognized Jesus as the promised redeemer and spoke of him to others. Simeon's prayer: "Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace, according to Your word; for my eyes have seen Your salvation which You have prepared before the face of all peoples. A light to bring revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of Your people Israel."

FATHER'S MESSAGE

"Turn not Your face from Your child, for I am afflicted; hear me speedily. Give heed to my soul and redeem it."

(Psalm 68:18-19 LXX)

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we step into February, we embark on a profoundly spiritual journey marked by the Triodion period. This sacred time — leading us from the Pre-Lenten Sundays, through Great Lent, and towards the glory of Pascha — is an opportunity for deep reflection and renewal in our Christian life.

The Triodion is not merely a series of services or hymns; it is a spiritual map guiding us towards a more profound communion with God. In her wisdom, the Church lays before us each week themes that mirror our spiritual struggles and triumphs. These Sundays are not just days on a calendar; they are stepping-stones that help us "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18).

This season is so important that the Church offers two additional Sundays as a preparation: the Sunday of Zacchaeus and the Sunday of the Canaanite Woman. These two Sundays lead us into the Triodion.

Let us consider the Sunday of Zacchaeus, where we learn the value of seeking Christ, even when faced with societal ridicule. Zacchaeus, a man of short stature, climbs a sycamore tree just to see Jesus. His determination and disregard for public opinion exemplify the attitude we must adopt in our spiritual quest. The message is clear: seek Christ with all your heart, irrespective of external judgments.

Then comes the Sunday of the Canaanite Woman, a poignant reminder of unwavering faith and humility. Her persistence in seeking Christ's mercy, likened to a dog's loyalty to its master, is a powerful lesson in faithfulness and devotion. It teaches us that true contact with Christ comes from a heart full of faith and humility, no matter the trials we face.

As we enter into the Pre-Lenten Triodion period, we encounter the profound lessons of the Publican and the Pharisee, the Prodigal Son, and the Sundays of Meatfare and Cheesefare. Each of these Sundays presents us with vivid scriptural images and teachings that challenge us to introspection and transformation.

The self-justification of the Pharisee reminds us that if we follow his example, we walk the path of condemnation and destruction, while the humble and constrained cry of the Publican attracts the blessing of God, for, "a broken and humbled heart God will not despise" (Psalm 50:17).

FATHER'S MESSAGE, Con't

The following Sunday we hear the beautiful parable of the Prodigal Son — or as some prefer to call it, the parable of the Loving Father — which reminds us that no matter how much we may have distanced ourselves from God, our heavenly Father awaits us with an open and paternal embrace. All we must do is to come to ourselves and say freely from our hearts, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before You, and I am not worthy to be called Your child" (Luke 15:21). These wonderful stories guide us to recognize our own spiritual failings and the boundless mercy of God.

Meatfare Sunday, with its emphasis on the final judgment, calls us to a life of genuine love and service to others. It teaches us that our actions towards the least of our brethren are the true measure of our love for Christ. Cheesefare Sunday then brings us to the brink of Great Lent, reminding us of Adam's exile from Paradise and our own spiritual journey back to the Father.

And so, as we embark on this Triodion journey, let us embrace it with the fullness of our hearts. Let us seek, with humility and faith, the face of Christ, just as Zacchaeus and the Canaanite woman did. Let us be reminded, through the parables of the Publican and the Prodigal Son, of the transformative power of repentance and God's boundless mercy. And may this Triodion period be for us all, a time of spiritual renewal and growth, drawing us closer to the loving embrace of our Heavenly Father.

THEOPHANY HOUSE BLESSING SCHEDULING FORM

"WHAT IS THEOPHANY?" Each year on January 6 we celebrate the great feast of the Theophany of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, where God is revealed to the world as Trinity. At the Theophany, Christ is baptized in the River Jordan by St. John the Baptist, and we are presented with a great mystery: "He who is the Master of all is baptized by a servant, and He gives mankind cleansing through water."

<u>BLESSING OF HOMES</u>: After the Blessing of the Water Service on January 6, Fr. Eleftherios will begin blessing the homes of our parish with holy water.

WHAT IS A HOUSE BLESSING? In celebration of Theophany — and throughout the month of January — Orthodox Christians invite Christ not only into their hearts, but also their homes. We call upon Him to bring the blessings and spiritual cleansing of the Jordan into our daily lives. The priest blesses our homes with Holy Water from the Theophany service, offering prayers for health, family, and God's abundant blessings in the coming year.

WHAT DO I NEED TO DO?

- Please prepare a list of your family members' names and an icon for the blessing.
- The service will begin in the dining room or an area where your icons are displayed.
- You will be asked to guide the priest throughout your home for the Holy Water blessing.
- Kindly ensure a quiet environment by turning off televisions and silencing cell phones.

YOUTH SAFETY WORKERS

Who is considered a Youth Safety Worker?

All Clergymen (Bishops/Priests/Deacons, both Active & Retired)

Pastoral Assistants & Youth Directors

People assisting, in any ministry, where the participants are under 18 years of age or in high school, whichever is later.

Including Parish Youth Safety Administrators, Church School Teachers, Dance Directors, Greek School Teachers, Youth Advisors (including Chaperones & Drivers) and Parish

Even... Parents who occasionally help-out, but are alone with other people's children.

Each Youth Safety Worker is required to register yearly with the church.

Registration is available through the church office. In addition, all Youth Safety Workers are required to take two courses (on-line training platform) annually and to complete a background check every other year.

Here is the website: Please register at https://ncsrisk.org/goarch/. The first course, Youth Safety, has two parts. The second course, Youth Worker Regulations, has one part. Prompt completion is necessary as one cannot participate in any youth programs without being registered, having a background check, having PA state clearances, and completing the two courses.
