The Forty Martyrs of Sebaste were a group of Roman soldiers in the early fourth century who boldly professed their Christian faith despite facing severe persecution under Emperor Licinius. Stationed in the city of Sebaste in Armenia, they were commanded to renounce Christ and offer sacrifices to the pagan gods. Refusing to comply, they were subjected to cruel torture and ultimately sentenced to a slow death by exposure. Stripped of their clothing, they were cast into a freezing lake on a bitterly cold night, with a warm bathhouse nearby meant to lure any who might renounce their faith. One soldier succumbed to temptation and left the lake, but his place was miraculously filled when a pagan guard, inspired by the martyrs' faith, confessed Christ and joined them in the icy waters. Strengthened by their devotion, the martyrs endured the trial together, giving up their lives but not their Christian Faith.

The martyrdom of the Forty became a powerful testament to unwavering faith and communal perseverance. Their sacrifice was widely honored in both the Eastern and Western Churches, with numerous hymns and writings commemorating their victory. St. Basil the Great and St. Gregory of Nyssa both praised their stead-fastness, recognizing them as models of Christian unity and endurance. Their feast day, celebrated on March 9, continues to inspire the faithful to remain steadfast in trials, trusting in Christ's promise of eternal life.

FATHER'S MESSAGE

March 2025

"The stadium of virtue is now open; those who wish to compete, enter therein..."

(Aposticha, Vespers of Cheesefare Sunday)

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we embark once again on the sacred journey of Great Lent, we are reminded that this is not merely a season of fasting, but is for each of us an opportunity for deep spiritual renewal. As we've discussed before, in the early Church, Lent was a time of preparation for catechumens; a period of transformation that led to their baptism at Pascha. Even for those of us already baptized, Lent remains a time of renewal and repentance—it is a return to the grace of our baptism, a second baptism of sorts as the Fathers describe it.

His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew reminds us in his catechetical homily for Great Lent this year that our Orthodox faith is profoundly personal, yet never individualistic. Lent calls us to a life of repentance, but also calls us to a life of love—a journey that is both self-reflective and communal. The asceticism of this season is not about a mere change in diet but about reordering and reorienting our lives in Christ. True fasting is not just abstaining from certain foods but abstaining from sin, as St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Do you fast? Give me proof of it by your works. If you see a poor man, have mercy. If you see an enemy, be reconciled."

At the very heart of this journey is forgiveness, which stands at the center of our Christian faith and life. Christianity itself is, above all, the faith of forgiveness. God forgives us, and His forgiveness is revealed in Christ, His Son, whom He sends to us so that by sharing in His humanity, we may also share in His love and be reconciled with Him and with those around us. Thus, Lent is more than a time of discipline—it is a renewal of love, a return to love, and a deepening of love. This is why the Church calls us to begin this season with Forgiveness Vespers. For truly, forgiveness is both the starting point and the necessary condition for the Lenten journey.

The hymns of this season remind us of our spiritual renewal. They call us to cultivate humility, to break free from the pride of the Pharisee, and to return to the Father like the Prodigal Son. They call us to love, as shown in the Parable of the Last Judgment, where Christ teaches us that salvation is found in how we serve the least among us. And they call us to forgiveness, as we hear on Cheesefare Sunday: "If you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you" (*Matthew 6:14*).

FATHER'S MESSAGE, Con't

As we step onto this path, let us embrace the spirit of the Church's hymnography, which exhorts us:

"The stadium of virtue is now open; those who wish to compete, enter therein, girded for the good contest of Lent, for those who compete according to the rules shall receive their laurels rightfully. Taking up the full armor of the Cross, let us do battle against the Enemy. As an impregnable wall, we have the Faith, prayer as our breastplate, and acts of mercy as our helmet. Instead of sword, there is fasting, which cuts every evil from the heart. He who does this shall attain a true crown from Christ, the King of all, on Judgment Day." (Aposticha, Vespers of Cheesefare Sunday)

May this Great Lent be a time of transformation for each of us. May we walk this path with repentance, prayer, and love, so that when we arrive at Holy Pascha, we may truly experience the joy of Christ's glorious Resurrection.



Canonical: Living within the canonical standards of the Greek Orthodox church, be it through, baptism and chrismation, becoming a godparent and marriage



YOUTH SAFETY WORKERS

All Clergymen (Bishops/Priests/Deacons, both Active & Retired)
Pastoral Assistants & Youth Directors

People assisting, in any ministry, where the participants are under 18 years of age or in high school, whichever is later.

Including Parish Youth Safety Administrators, Church School Teachers, Dance Directors, Greek School Teachers, Youth Advisors (including Chaperones & Drivers) and Parish Council.

Even... Parents who occasionally help-out but are alone with other people's children.

Each Youth Safety Worker is required to register yearly with the church.

Registration is available through the church office. In addition, all Youth Safety Workers are required to take two courses (on-line training platform) annually and to complete a background check every other year.

Here is the website: Please register at https://ncsrisk.org/goarch/. The first course, Youth Safety, has two parts. The second course, Youth Worker Regulations, has one part. Prompt completion is necessary as one cannot participate in any youth programs without being registered, having a background check, having PA state clearances, and completing the two courses.
