

Saint Luke, the beloved physician and companion of the Apostle Paul, is the author of the Gospel that bears his name and the Acts of the Apostles. Born in Antioch, he was a man of learning and skill, remembered also as the first to paint holy icons of the Mother of God and the Apostles Peter and Paul. Traveling with Saint Paul on his missionary journeys, Luke witnessed the spread of the Gospel and carefully recorded the work of Christ and the early Church. He preached the Good News throughout the Mediterranean world until, at an old age, he gave his life for Christ in Greece. Saint Luke reminds us that God calls each of us to use our talents—whatever they may be—for the glory of His Kingdom. The Church celebrates his feast each year on October 18.

### FATHER'S MESSAGE

"Today this Scripture has been fulfilled..." (Luke 4:21)

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the lectionary of our Church, we have just begun reading the Sunday Gospel passages from Luke (this cycle begins at the end of September and continues until Great Lent). Early in Luke's Gospel, we encounter the beginning of Christ's ministry with His return to His hometown of Nazareth (Luke 4:16–30). As was His custom, Jesus entered the synagogue on the Sabbath and stood up to read. The passage was from the prophet Isaiah: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to preach good news to the poor... to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

When He had finished, Jesus sat down and declared something astonishing: "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." This was no ordinary sermon. Jesus was not simply teaching about God's promises; He was announcing that those promises were being fulfilled in Him. The long-awaited time of Jubilee (as described in Leviticus 25) had arrived: a time of release, forgiveness, and restoration. Debts were forgiven, the oppressed set free, and new beginnings granted. Of course, Christ Himself is our Jubilee, offering freedom from sin and new life in His Kingdom.

At first, those in the synagogue marveled at His gracious words. But when Jesus reminded them that God's mercy had once been shown not to Israel, but to outsiders—a widow in Sidon and Naaman the Syrian—their admiration turned to fury. They could not accept a Messiah who extended God's grace beyond their expectations. In anger, they drove Him out of the synagogue and even sought to kill Him.

This scene teaches us two insightful truths. First, the Kingdom of God is not distant or abstract: it is breaking into our lives every day. Each time we repent, forgive, and allow Christ to heal that which is broken, Isaiah's words are fulfilled again in us. Second, God's mercy is far greater than our imaginations. Like the people of Nazareth, we may sometimes want God's grace only on our own terms, for those who are like us. Yet the Lord stretches our understanding and enlarges our hearts, teaching us to see every person—even the outsider, even our enemy—as someone who is loved and redeemed by Him. Christ, after all, came not for the righteous alone, but for all of humanity.

### FATHER'S MESSAGE, Con't

The challenge faced by those in Nazareth is the same challenge for us: will we receive Christ on His terms, or insist on our own? The good news is that Jesus still "passes through the midst" of our constant rejection and continues to offer us His presence, His forgiveness, and His Kingdom. May we have the faith to embrace Him, the humility to welcome His grace wherever it appears, and the courage to live as bearers of His good news and healing presence in our community.

I appreciate the support from all of you and thanks for sharing your children with us every Sunday!


